DeltonaTV expands programming

DELTONATV HAS ADDED NEW PROGRAMS to its on-air schedule, that include current affairs programming as well as nature and safety oriented shows.

Some of the new programs are produced by the University of Central Florida, and are only available to Deltona residents and only through the City's TV station.

DeltonaTV is available to anyone living inside the City limits who have Bright House Networks for their cable provider.



Examples of other programming include: showcasing how our residents can greenscape their yards, how to conserve water, learn about central Florida's wildlife and wild spaces, and how to be smart and safe when cycling in and around Central Florida. By adding these programs, DTV becomes more of a full service government TV facility... providing information on a local, State and National level about government operations and resident quality of life.

The addition of these new programs will not affect the current on-air schedule of City Commission Meetings both live and for re-broadcast. Viewers will now find a greater variety of programs to watch when Commission meetings are not being broadcast. DTV will also include programming that is more educational for younger viewers... focusing on wildlife and nature conservancy. For a complete DeltonaTV schedule, visit deltonafl.gov and under the "Residents" tab at the top choose "Communication & Public Information." To get the exact air times for meetings and staff-created public service announcements, choose the "Daily Schedule for DeltonaTV" on the same page.

DeltonaTV began broadcasting in February of 2007, with its Community Bulletin Board on Bright House Channel 99. Then in March, the City TV station inaugurated its programming capabilities with the live broadcast of the March 7 Commission Meeting. Since that time, the station was relocated by Bright House to digital channel 199... and the programming choices were expanded with the additional broadcasts of Commissioner's Town Hall Meetings, City Commission Workshops, Joint Meetings between the Deltona City Commission and various Commission Advisory Boards along with special broadcasts of City events. In addition, "How-to" messages, Safety Tips and Department Profiles were included in the DTV daily schedule. **For a schedule of Commission Meeting broadcast see Page 3.**

Celebrate National Night Out with VCSO

THE VOLUSIA COUNTY SHERIFF'S Office and the City of Deltona would like to invite you to this year's National Night Out event planned for City Hall, 2345 Providence Blvd.

Now in its 27th year, National Night Out is a unique crime prevention event sponsored by the National Association of Town Watch. In 2009, over 36 million people participated in National Night Out, and participants included citizens, law enforcement agencies, businesses, neighborhood watch groups, and local officials from over 15,000 communities across the 50 states.

Historically, participation in Deltona was limited to those communities with an established neighborhood watch group. Those groups typically gathered in their community on the night of the event and had a block party. In recent years, participation has declined and the Sheriff's Office and the City of Deltona want to see that change.

National Night Out is an opportunity to heighten crime prevention awareness, generate participation in neighborhood watch groups, enhance community spirit, strengthen police-community partnerships, and most importantly, send a message to criminals that crime will not be tolerated.

This year's event will have all that and more.



Planned for 5:30 p.m. to 8 p.m., Aug. 3 with activities centralized at City Hall, the Sheriff's Office and the Deltona Fire Department will have vehicles and equipment on display, including demonstrations by the motorcycle and K-9 units, a special appearance by the Sheriff's Office helicopter "Air-1," children's fingerprinting, and food and drinks, just to name a few.

Please come out and meet some of the men and women from the Sheriff's Office and Fire Department, talk with city officials, spend time with members of your community, and send a big message to criminals that the City of Deltona is united in the fight against crime.

Homes available through Community Development Office

THE CITY OF DELTONA HAS THUS FAR purchased 30 homes and 2 vacant lots within the Neighborhood Stabilization Program (NSP). Now the City is beginning the home rehabilitation portion of the NSP program--to provide affordable homes that are U.S. Department of Housing & Urban Development (HUD) subsidized.

Applications are being accepted for potential home buyers interested in purchasing one of the homes by contacting

Angelia Briggs in the Community Development Office, (386) 878-8614. To be eligible, home buyers need to obtain 8 hours of HUD certified counseling and meet the target incomes for the program. Upon acceptance, the City's housing counselors and real estate brokers will be available to work with the applicant to receive the housing counseling, down payment assistance, and loan acceptance to purchase a house.



