THE PHILADELPHIA UNION, THE MAJOR League Soccer team of Philadelphia has chosen the Dewey O. Boster Sports Complex for the third year in a row as their home for spring training.

This year the Union organization is striving for more community involvement in Deltona. They will host a variety of community events in and around the Deltona area during the club's 2013 Pre Season training, February 9-23, the club announced in December. Events such as kids clinics, a chance to train with the Union First Team, open practices and a scrimmage will all take place at Dewey O. Boster. Union players will also visit select elementary and middle schools. In addition to a scrimmage, the club will compete against six other MLS, United Soccer League and North American Soccer League clubs in the 2013 Disney Pro Soccer Classic Tournament at the ESPN Wide World of Sports Complex at Walt Disney World.

The six MLS teams participating in Central Florida Soccer Spring Training, as well as Orlando City Soccer Club and the Tampa Bay Rowdies will compete in two weeks of group play, with Group A consisting of Orlando City, Philadelphia Union, Toronto FC and Columbus Crew. Teams in Group B include the Tampa Bay Rowdies, D.C. United, Montreal Impact and Sporting Kansas City with four games on Feb. 9, 13, 16 and 23.

"Our Deltona family is extremely honored that the Philadelphia Union has chosen to make the City of Deltona their Pre Season training facility," said Deltona Mayor John

Masiarczyk. "We are very proud of our excellent soccer facilities and sincerely appreciate the Union recognizing all that Deltona has to offer. We welcome all Philadelphia Union fans to our great City and look forward to a terrific season for the Union and a long-term partnership between the Union and the City of Deltona!"

Clinics for kids will be on Feb. 10 and 18, giving young fans the opportunity to watch one hour of First Team practice, meet the players and then compete in an hour of skills competitions and drills. On Feb. 20, the Union will scrimmage against an opponent to be decided later at the Dewey O. Boster Sports Complex at 6 p.m.

The Union are also offering a Train With The Pros clinic on February 14, which allows fans to learn from members of the Union First Team and

Meet three of Deltona's finest from VCSO

INVESTIGATOR DON MAXWELL BEGAN HIS CAREER WITH THE Sheriff's Office approximately four and a half years ago. After completing his training he was assigned to road patrol in Deltona.

Investigator Maxwell was often praised for the outstanding work he did while in uniform patrol and in 2010 was selected as Deputy of the Quarter. Investigator Maxwell left patrol two years ago and since then he has been assigned to the Property Section of our Criminal Investigations unit. Investigator Maxwell has a passion for finding the "bad guys" and he doesn't limit his efforts to his own cases. He constantly volunteers to help others, too. During a recent investigation into a series of burglaries, Maxwell discovered that similar crimes were going on in neighboring counties. This prompted Maxwell to work with several other agencies and earn impressive results: four arrests for 10 cases in three counties. In another investigation Maxwell assisted patrol deputies in the arrest of four juveniles connected to at least a dozen vehicle burglaries and a stolen car. Investigator Maxwell was selected a Investigator of the Quarter for the third Quarter 2012.

Investigator Maxwell would like to remind residents of Deltona to keep all the doors and windows to your residence and vehicles locked at all times. Investigator Maxwell also suggests you document serial numbers on valuables, engrave ones with a unique marking that do not have a serial number or take a quality photograph of the item. One last suggestion is to install alarms, high definition video surveillance equipment and ensure your residence has adequate lighting.

Deputy Cody Cochran is a brand new deputy who is already making a very big impact. On May 25, 2012, Deputy Cochran responded to a residence in Deltona where a one year old baby was found unresponsive in the family's swimming pool. Upon arriving on scene the baby was in the arms of a family member. Deputy Cochran took immediate action and noticed the baby was not breathing. Deputy Cochran performed CPR and was suc-



cessful in reviving the baby. The baby made a full recovery and has Deputy Cochran to thank for saving his life. Since June 5, 2012, Deputy Cochran has made over 208 arrests, confiscated (4) vehicles pending forfeiture proceedings and seized approximately \$7,000 in cash. Deputy Cochran maintains a very positive attitude and always gives 110% effort. The vast majority of Deputy Cochran's arrests are for drug and traffic related offenses. Deputy Cochran would like to encourage you to report any suspicious activity immediately to the Sheriff's Office.

Deputy Matt Seltzer is the newest member of the Motor Unit in Deltona. Deputy Seltzer has been with the Sheriff's Office for two and a half years and was assigned to uniform patrol prior to his new position. Deputy Seltzer has a passion for traffic safety and enforcement. Deputy Seltzer's duties include school zone enforcement, traffic crash investigations, DUI enforcement, and assisting with traffic control. Deputy Seltzer will be attending traffic homicide investigation classes in January 2013. Deputy Seltzer would like to remind you wear your seat belts and ensure your children under age 16 wear a helmet while riding a bicycle. Deputy Seltzer is looking forward to positive citizen encounters with the residents of Deltona.

As you can see the Sheriff's Office provides many services to the residents of Deltona on a day to day basis. Investigator Maxwell, Deputy Cochran, and Deputy Seltzer, are just a few examples of the hard work and dedication put forth by the deputies working in Deltona. 

